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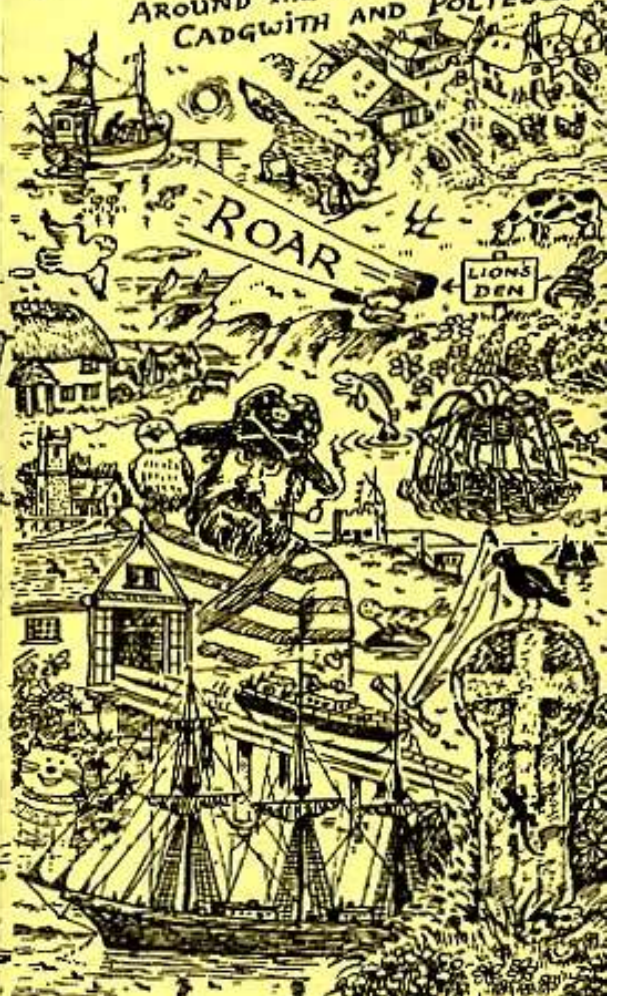
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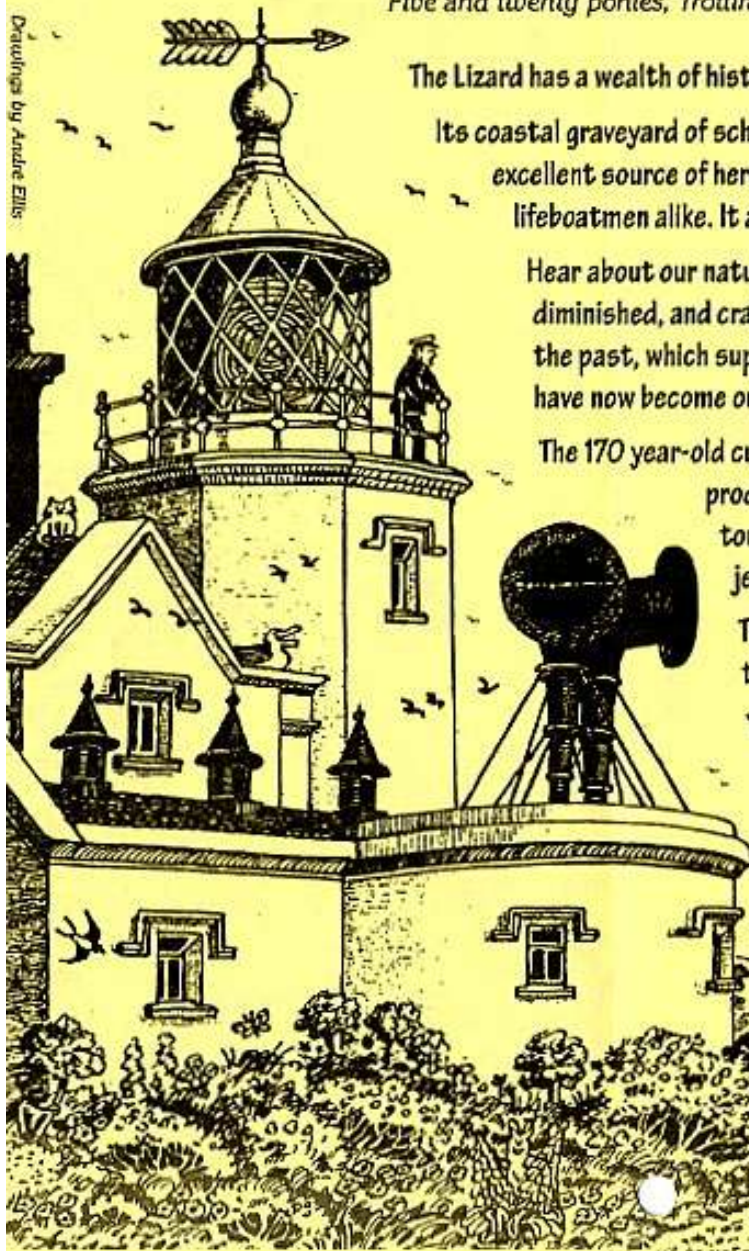

The Lizard has a wealth of history and is a geologist's and botanist's haven.

Its coastal graveyard of schooners, barques and steamers, wrecked upon unforeseen rocks is an excellent source of heroic tales of crews and passengers, rescued by fishermen and lifeboatmen alike. It also reveals more sinister stories of smuggling, wrecking and pillage.

Hear about our natural industries of the past and present, such as the pilchard trade, now diminished, and crabbing, which still operates from our idyllic coves. More small farm holdings existed in the past, which supplied the local community before transportation improved, bringing visitors whom have now become our local industry.

The 170 year-old custom of cutting and turning serpentine, our rare, local bedrock, was earlier used to produce large works of art such as mantelpieces, but later adapted itself to suit the new tourist industry by producing small giftware such as miniature lighthouses, clocks and jewellery.

These and many more topics are discussed in my guided walks which take you on a two to three hour adventure generally finishing-up in local cafe with yet more tales!

You shall of course need walking boots and appropriate weather-gear. The weather can become cool and wet at any time with our unusual climate - especially on the coastal path. Who knows? You may even need sun-cream!!!
